Procedures for Elimination Competition**

**A. PLAY DATES AND LOCATIONS**

Girls Singles:	Preliminary Round	Wed., April 15	at St. Francis Xavier
Boys Singles:	Preliminary Round	Wed., April 15	at Archbishop MacDonald
Girls/Boys Singles:	Metro vs. Public	Thurs., April 16	at Salisbury

Girls Doubles:	Preliminary Round	Mon., April 20	at Salisbury
Boys Doubles:	Preliminary Round	Mon., April 20	at Bev Facey
Girls/Boys Doubles:	Metro vs. Public	Tues., April 21	at Ross Sheppard

Mixed Doubles:	Preliminary round	Thurs., April 23	at Leduc
Mixed Doubles:	Metro vs. Public	Friday, April 24	at Holy Trinity

**METRO vs. PUBLIC**

Singles: Top two from each site will advance to Metro vs. Public.  
Mixed/Doubles: Top team from each site will advance to Metro vs. Public.

**Provincial Badminton:** May 1, 2 – St. Paul – bus will leave Thursday, April 30 approx. 4:00 p.m.  
**All students must be registered on the ASAA Ex Net registration site by April 15, 2009**

**B. ENTRY DEADLINES**

**NOTE:** IF SCHOOLS FAIL TO REGISTER THEIR PLAYERS BY THE DATES INDICATED, THEY MAY NOT BE ELIGIBLE TO PLAY. IT IS IMPERATIVE THAT YOUR STUDENTS WHO ARE REGISTERED SHOW UP AT THE PLAYOFFS, AS SCHEDULES ARE PREPARED IN ADVANCE OF THE PLAYOFF. **IF YOUR PLAYERS CANNOT ATTEND PROVINCIALS ON MAY 1, 2 THEY SHOULD NOT BE ENTERED IN THE ZONE PLAYOFFS.**

1. **Girls and Boys Singles** – entry form must be provided by Tues., April 14 – 2:00 p.m.
2. **Girls and Boys Doubles** – entry form must be provided by Fri., April 17 – 2:00 p.m.
3. **Mixed Doubles** – entry form must be provided by Wed., April 22 – 2:00 p.m.

**Number of Entries:**

Each school is allowed **one entry per category per event.** Schools should hold playoffs in their school to determine their best three (3) entrants.

**D. CATEGORY PARAMETERS - A.S.A.A. RULES**

Junior:	Under 16 years of age before September 1st of 2008;
Intermediate:	Under 17 years of age before September 1st of 2008;
Senior:	Under 19 years of age before September 1st of 2008;

**ZONE TOURNAMENT PARAMETERS - Preliminary Round**

Preliminary Elimination tournament schedule will be set up by the tournament host coach using the following parameters:

- A. 1 - 5 entrants; one pool, single round robin schedule (single game match)  
Games to 21 points. Must win by 2 – cap at 30 points.

Preliminary final; 2nd vs. 1st, best of three up to 21 points. Must win by 2 – cap at 30 points.

- B. 6 or more entrants; two pools, single round robin schedule (single game match)  
Games to 21 points; Must win by 2 – cap at 30 points

Semi-finals - pools cross over

2nd vs. 1st

Best of three up to 21 points

1st vs. 2nd

Two winners advance to the preliminary finals. Best of three up to 21 points. Must win by 2 – cap at 30 points

Note: there is no option like the old "setting" – the extended game automatically comes into play at 20 all.

**Tie breaks: (same as Provincials)**

- i) All two way ties for 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the round robin will be determined by the result of the match between the two tied players/teams.
- ii) In a three way tie for 1<sup>st</sup> place, the players/teams will be ranked 1,2 and 3 based first on games won minus games lost and second on points won minus points lost. The 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> ranked players/teams will play one game to 21 points to determine second place in the round robin.
- iii) In a three way tie for second place, the players will be ranked 1, 2, and 3 as described in ii above. The seconded and third ranked players will play one game to 21 points to determine who will play the first ranked player/team in one game to 21 points that will then determine 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the round robin.

To determine the top team in each pool(s), players/teams play each other's team in their pool one game up to 21 points. Must win by 2 – cap at 30 points.

Note: The final best of three match must always be played to determine the number 1 team (even if the two teams which advance to the final are from the same pool in the preliminary round). The results from the preliminary round are only used to determine which teams advance to the semi-finals.

**ZONE FINAL PARAMETERS**

**Metro League vs. Edmonton Public**

Top team (**doubles and mixed**) from each preliminary site advance to the Zone Final;

Top two players (**singles competition**) from each preliminary site advance to Zone Final;

**Singles Competition:**

Metro #2 vs. Edmonton Public #1

Metro #1 vs. Edmonton Public #2

Note: If both number ones win, another match has to be played to determine #1 and #2 ranked players from the Edmonton Zone. If both teams come from the same league, the preliminary final result will be used to determine #1 and #2.

All Zone Final matches are best of three up to 21 points. Must win by 2 – cap at 30.

**Note:** In singles competition, the top two advance to the Provincials, in Doubles and Mixed competition, the top team only advances.

**Singles:** There should be a playoff for 3rd and 4th positions in the event the top team(s) cannot attend Provincials. If your team(s) cannot attend Provincials they should not be involved in the elimination tournament.
