**1A- 4A Girls** The lowest three individual scorers in addition to students on the Zone winning team are eligible for Provincials.

Girls will advance to Provincials as individuals if they score 90 or better in their zone tournament and have not qualified with their respective team.

**3A/4A Boys** The lowest two individual scorers in addition to students on the Zone winning team are eligible for Provincials.

Any Zone with more than 15 teams competing in their Zone Tournament will receive an additional berth.

**1A-2A Boys** The lowest two individual scorers in addition to students on the Zone winning team are eligible for Provincials.

**Entry Deadline**

Team entries must be faxed to Fax: 437 – 7480 or emailed to metroedm@telusplanet.net by **Thursday, September 15, 12:00 noon**. **Players must be ranked from 1 to 4 with**

**handicap indicated – see attached ranking form.** PLEASE ENSURE YOUR ATHLETES ARE AWARE OF THE RULES/ETIQUETTE OF GOLF.

MAXIMUM OF 18 HANDICAP FOR BOYS AND A MAXIMUM SCORE OF 144 FOR GIRLS. PLAYERS THAT DO NOT MEET THIS STANDARD SHOULD NOT BE ENTERED. **PLEASE KNOW THE CALIBRE OF YOUR GOLFERS PRIOR TO ENTERING THEM.**

**Eligibility – ASAA On-Line Registrations are due September 12<sup>th</sup>**

Schools are allowed up to a maximum of four (4) girls and four (4) boys. (Top three scores used for team totals) A.S.A.A. eligibility requirements must be followed (i.e. under 19 as of September 1st, minimum of 800 instructional minutes per week, three years of eligibility from entry into Grade 10).

**Golf Course Etiquette**

**Please ensure the following are brought to your golfers' attention:**

1. Tee markers must not be taken;
2. Divots must be replaced;
3. Sand traps must be raked;
4. Yard markers must not be pulled out;
5. Conduct in the clubhouse - please be courteous

### **Tournament Supervision**

All schools entering a team must send a teacher/parent representative to the course.

### **Draw**

The Tee times will be done by the Athletics Office and will be posted on the website and emailed to schools on Friday, September 16<sup>th</sup>.

### **Tie Breaker**

In the individual competition, in the event of ties for 1st, 2nd or 3rd positions, a sudden death play-off will take place.

In the Team Competition, in the event of a tie for 1st, 2nd or 3rd positions, a sudden death play-off will take place as follows: from each of the tied teams, the three team members with the lowest gross scores after 18 holes will represent their team in the tie breaker. The team with the lowest total score on the sudden death hole(s) will be declared the winner.

### **League Entry Fee**

Schools will be billed their pro rated share of the cost of Medallions when they are billed for green fees.

### **Rain Out**

There is no rain out date set. The tournament will go - rain, snow or shine!  
(unless cancelled by the Golf Course)

## **PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING**

Coaches should inform their players of the proper rules and golf etiquette. Some of the most common violations are listed below:

**PLAY READY GOLF and KEEP THE PACE MOVING.** Boys should be able to complete round in under 5 hours and girls in under 6 hours. Note: Redtail – round must be completed within 4.5 hours.

1. In any hazard the club must not be grounded until it hits the ball (sand or grass traps). If this is done a one stroke penalty is added.
2. Once the ball is hit from the tee, the ball cannot be lifted off the ground by the hand or moved on the fairway to better your lie. This is a violation and a one stroke penalty.
3. Provisional ball rule - golfers that suspect they lost a ball off the tee should hit a provisional ball before searching for the first ball. If the ball is lost, the golfer then can play the provisional ball from where it lands. Lost ball is a two stroke penalty. Hitting a provisional ball counts three strokes from the tee.
4. Unplayable lies: Ball may be placed one club length no closer to the green in either direction by dropping the ball with your hand. One stroke penalty.
5. There is no such thing as winter rules. Ball must be played from any part of the fairway and not moved. Refer to #2.
6. Golfers must mark their ball on the green if requested by another player. A player putting and hitting another player's ball in the process is penalized two strokes. The ball hit must be placed back in the location of the impact as best as possible to the player's judgment.
7. Ball must be teed off between the blue/red markers and not in front. The ball can be placed back behind the markers up to a maximum distance of two club lengths. Violation of this rule is a two stroke penalty.
