TEAM HANDBALL REGULATIONS

Game Play information

- All games are 2 x 25 min half's
- Half Time is 3 min
- Each team is allowed 3 time outs per game. A team can use a maximum of 2 time outs per half and can only use one in the last 3 minutes of the game.
- Team can have up to 16 players dressed for each game.
- Eligibility as per ASAA policy.
- Double sided tape is allowed to assist athletes in gripping the ball. (no stick um)
- Playing rules: www.teamhandball.ab.ca
- Penalties – direct red card, player is ejected from the game. The ejection is an automatic one game suspension for the next game.
- Three (3) two minute penalties against one player in a game, equals a red card. Player is removed from the game. This red card does not constitute a game suspension for the next game.
- Teams must be registered on the ASAA Exnet registration site by March 22, 2012
- Official game ball is the Alberta Team Handball Federation approved size 3 (boys) and size 2 (girls)
- Uniforms and protective equipment must conform to IHF rules and regulations. All players are expected to dress in team uniforms that are consistent with school colors; no club insignia is permitted. The goalkeeper must wear colors that distinguish him/her from the court players of both teams and the goalkeeper of the other team. No duplication of numbers is allowed.

Teams will be awarded 2 points for a win and 1 point for a tie.

Round robin ties remain tied. Playoff tie breaker: Ties in play-offs will go into 2 X 2 minute overtime with no half time break. No time outs in over time. Over time periods are not sudden death.

If still tied, there will be a five player shoot-out, and if still tied after five shooters, a sudden death shoot-out will take place.

Round Robin tie breaker:

If two or more teams are tied at the end of round robin play, the following tie breaker will take place: Head to head game(s) between the tied teams; then goals for and against between the tied teams only; then goals for and against in all round robin games; then most goals for in round robin; then least goals against in round robin.

Winner of boys and girls Championship games will advance.
