

METRO EDMONTON HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION VOLLEYBALL LEAGUE INFORMATION - 2011

SEASONS OF PLAY (as per A.S.A.A. Policy)

June 1st until the last Saturday of November.

Double headers will be scheduled when possible.

Junior Boys and Girls play Tuesday/Thursday

Senior Boys and Girls play Monday/Wednesday.

Leagues will alternate early/late games ONLY IN THE EVENT OF A DOUBLE HEADER

Tuesday: Jr. Girls 4:45 Jr. Boys 6:15

Thursday: Jr. Girls 6:15 Jr. Boys 4:45

Monday: Sr. Girls 4:45 Sr. Boys 6:15

Wednesday: Sr. Girls 6:15 Sr. Boys 4:45

ELIGIBILITY:

Junior: Grade 10 or 11 - two years of junior eligibility

Senior: open to all grade levels

- Students must be under 19.0 as of September 1 of the school year,
three (3) years eligibility, minimum of 800 instructional minutes per week;

A Junior player is allowed to play in one game at the Senior level. Once the Junior plays or dresses in two games at the Senior level, they must remain at the Senior level. Games won by teams using "ineligible players" will result in the loss of those games.

NOTE: A.S.A.A. Two Team Policy: To be eligible for high school Provincial competition in the ASAA sports of basketball, volleyball, football, cheerleading, team handball and rugby, a high school student is not permitted to play on a non-school team in the same sport during the same season. (page 37 of ASAA handbook.

A.S.A.A. on-line registrations for Junior AND Senior Teams must be completed by October 1st. ALL JUNIOR and SENIOR TEAMS MUST REGISTER WITH ASAA. Transfer Forms must be completed for any student transferring in from another school.

RULES OF PLAY (AS PER CVA RULES) with A.S.A.A. rule modifications as follows:

1. Substitutes – modified 12 substitute rule will be used.
 - a team shall be allowed a maximum of 12 substitutions in any one game;
 - a player may leave the game and re-enter the game, but only for the same player.
Players are "tied" together; e.g. 7 for 12 – these two players are attached for that game and a player must re-enter for the same player;
 - unlimited substitutions are allowed up to 12 per game

i.e. i) 7 for 12; 12 for 7 (2 subs) X 6 = 12 subs
ii) 7 for 12; 12 for 7 (2 subs) x 2 = 4 subs
8 for 6; 6 for 8 (2 subs) x 2 = 8 subs
2. The top of the net is to be set at the height of 2.43 for males and 2.24 for females.
3. Allow teams to list up to 15 on the score sheet.
4. Game Ball: The official ball shall be the Tachikara SV5W Gold-SWB.
5. ASAA is not adopting the FIVB uniform rule.
Rally point scoring - 25 points, played to a two point difference with no cap for games 1,2,3,4.
Game 5 - 15 points, played to a two point difference with no cap;
Games will commence at 4:45 p.m or 5:00 p.m.;
Host school will have gym ready for warm up at 4:20 p.m.
Host school MUST PROVIDE minor officials - 1 umpire - 2 scorers - 2 lines people
Score sheets and dressing room facilities provided by host school.
If no official arrives to do the match, schools have the option of rescheduling the match or proceeding with an official agreed upon by both coaches.

Winning Team is responsible for phoning Athletics Office – 989 – 3005 and the Publicist - 378 - 0181 with match score. These calls should be made immediately following the games to ensure scores are in the following day's paper. (Winning Team should provide Athletics Office with score sheet)

Metro Policy adopted Oct./03 – A no change zone will be in effect in all gymnasiums for all indoor sports. Any players (male or female) who need to change must report to the dressing room.

Metro Policy adopted April, 2010

Staff sponsors must be provided for all "out-of-school" coaches and sponsors must be in attendance at games. Staff sponsors must be employees of the respective School District. The staff sponsor must identify themselves to the opposing team prior to the game and remain on site (in the gym or on the field) for the duration of the game. In the event there is no staff sponsor on site, the game will be considered a default. In the event of extenuating circumstances, the default is subject to Appeal to the Executive Committee.

RESCHEDULING GAMES: In the event it is necessary to reschedule a game please arrange a new date with the opposing coach and then contact the Athletics Office to arrange for Officials. This should be done immediately following receipt of schedules. The Athletics Office should be notified at least twenty four (24) hours prior to any game change.

PROTESTS: (as per CVA Rules) A captain may legally protest only an error in applying a rule or rule interpretation (you may not protest a "judgment call"). The official must be notified immediately of the protest and the protest must be written on the game sheet at the time of the protest. The match will continue and the protest will be referred to the Athletics Office the following morning.

TIE BREAKING PROCEDURES:

If two or more teams are tied at the end of league play, the following criteria will be applied:

- a) The team having the best ratio of won/lost matches, considering matches between the tied teams;
- b) The team having the best ratio of won/lost sets, considering matches played between the tied teams;
- c) The team having the best ratio of won/lost sets, considering all matches of the round;
- d) The team having the best ratio of points for/against, considering sets played between the tied teams;
- e) The team having the best ratio of points for/against, considering all sets played;
